Responsibilities:	Leadership & Strategy
	 Ensure Kidney Wales complies with charity law, its governing documents and any other relevant legislation. Set and maintain the vision, mission and goals of Kidney Wales. Provide strategic leadership to the operational team, offering oversight and challenge, setting strategic direction, policy, goals and targets. Oversee the financial plans and budget and monitor and evaluate progress. Ensure risks are effectively identified, monitored and appropriate mitigations are put in place. Support the staff team to manage the operations of Kidney Wales. Attend board meetings quarterly, and subcommittees/task and finish groups as needed to support the staff team to progress specific pieces of work. Be an active champion of Kidney Wales.
